Biographical Information

John Bryant is currently an assistant coach for the Chicago Bulls of the NBA. Prior to going to the Bulls his coaching experience stems from the 76ers organization. He started his time as an assistant coach for their Delaware 87ers – Philly’s G-League affiliate – before receiving a promotion and joining former head coach Brett Brown’s staff in 2016. Prior to his experience with the 76ers, Bryant played basketball in college and the G-League. Bryant spent the past five seasons in the NBA Development League. The most recent two seasons as an Assistant Coach with the Delaware 87ers. Bryant served the remaining three as Associate Head Coach and Head Strength and Conditioning Coach with the Bakersfield Jam.

In addition to the D-League, he has been an Assistant Coach with the Nigerian Men's National basketball team for past two seasons. Most recently coaching the Nigerian team competing in the 2016 Rio Olympics this past summer.

Prior to his coaching career, he played professionally in the NBA D-League (Bakersfield), Australia, China, Czech Republic, England, Germany and the ABA. Bryant played his collegiate ball at St. Joseph’s University from 2001-05, where he started on the 2003-04 team that went 27-0 in the regular season. Bryant served as co-captain during his senior campaign with the Hawks.
